Our School Council met the Roofers!

On Monday the School Council met up with Paul from the roofing company as they had lots of questions about our roof. Please see below a report from the school council following their meeting:

Why are you fixing the roof?

Because the roof was very old and water was getting inside. The new roof will keep it dry and also make it nice and warm inside.

What materials do you use to make the new roof?

The main ones we use are timber which is planks of wood, boards and then it is covered in special felt which is what makes it waterproof.

What tools do you use?

We do have lots of different tools but some of the special ones we use on this type of roof are a nail gun which is what makes some of the noise you can hear inside, it has a special gas inside

which automatically fires the nails out to keep the wood in place. We also use a blow torch which produces a big flame to heat everything up because we have to make the rubber on the back of the felt go sticky so it seals it to the roof.

How do you get up and walk around on the roof?

If you look at the school you can see that there is scaffolding all around it. There is a special staircase around the side which we use to go up and down as it is easier to carry things up and down and there are special walkways all round the roof which again make it a bit safer and easier for us.

Is it scary up on the roof?

Your roof is not as high as some of the ones we go up on but safety is always very important especially when it is icy or wet and windy which can be a bit dangerous.

When will it be finished?

There is still quite a bit more to be done but we should be finished at the end of May.

We then had a look around at the scaffolding and Paul showed us the stairs and the walkway, we also saw some of the wood and boards that are being used to fix the roof.



Measles

A high temperature, runny or blocked nose, sneezing, a cough, red sore eyes.

Chicken Pox

Chicken pox can appear at any age. It usually gets better after 1-2 weeks, without the need to see a GP. An itchy, spotty rash is the main symptom, which can appear anywhere on the body.

Chicken pox appears in 3 stages:

- Small spots appear
- Spots become blisters
- Blisters become scabs

Other symptoms may include high temperature, generally feeling unwell and loss of appetite.

Children will need to stay off school until all spots have scabbed, usually 5 days after the spots appear.

Headlice

Headlice can make your head feel itchy or like something is moving in your hair. Treat headlice as soon as you spot them. You can treat headlice without seeing a GP.

To remove headlice, comb the hair with a special fine-toothed comb. You can buy these online or at pharmacies. There's no need to keep your child off school.

Lice can be removed by wet combing:

- Wash hair with ordinary shampoo, apply lots of conditioner.
- Comb the whole head of hair, from the roots to the ends.

Do wet combing on days 1, 5, 9 and 13 to catch any newly hatched head lice. Check again that hair is free of lice after 17 days. See www.nhs.uk/conditions/head-lice-and-nits/ for more information.
