



Pupil Premium Action Plan 2014-2015

The government has allocated a specific grant to every school, beginning in 2011/2012. The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) and their wealthier peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. In 2013-2014 our pupil premium allocation was £23.400

2014-2015 Action Plan

1. Recorders and tuition so that all children in Year 2 can learn to play an instrument.
2. Parental support workbooks for all KS1 pupils.
3. LSA to give children addition support with reading.
4. Teacher to give children addition support for PP pupils during year 2 maths/literacy streamed sessions.
5. TA to give children addition support for PP pupils during Year 1 Maths/Literacy streamed sessions.
6. Fund trips and events
7. Counselling for some FSM children.
8. Specific funding for support for some specific pupils.
