



Pupil Premium Impact 2016-2017

The government has allocated a specific grant to every school, beginning in 2011/2012. The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) and their wealthier peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. In the financial year 2016-2017 our pupil premium allocation was £21,761.

2016-2017 Action Plan

A member of the senior leadership team monitors the progress of pupil premium pupils, supports staff (teaching and non-teaching) with planning interventions to diminish any differences (0.1 FTE)

A teaching assistant is employed to diminish the differences for pupil premium pupils who have not reached expected level or have made insufficient progress (0.5 FTE).

Training to develop staff skills (particularly those who work with pupil premium pupils) and purchasing interventions which have been proven to narrow attainment gaps.

Recorder lessons for all Year 2 pupils and purchasing of recorders for these pupils.

Family support worker to support families with needs at home which are impacting on children's learning in school.

Pay for pupil premium pupils to attend school trips and events

Counselling and Art Therapy

Enrichment Days- These are days when the curriculum is enriched with visitors e.g. author or history workshop to inspire learning.

Pay for uniform for pupil premium pupils and purchasing water bottles for all pupils.
