


Key Stage 1 homework questionnaire 2020


Q1) In Key stage 1 (year 1 and 2) we received a total of 40 separate responses, representing 48 pupils (as some respondents had more than one child in the key stage).

Q2) I think the amount of homework my child currently receives is:




What we found out	What will we do
69% of parents feel the current amount of homework is just enough, whilst 23% feel their child does not currently receive enough homework.	Identify the areas in which parents feel their children may need more or different homework, whilst recognising the need to ensure homework continues to be manageable for both children and parents.

Q3) I feel that the homework my child currently receives helps me to support their learning and progress in school.




What we found out	What we will do
18% of parents do not feel that the current homework supports learning and progress in school.	Consult with parents (through the parent forum) and staff on how we can ensure homework sent home supports the learning that happens in school.

Q4) I feel confident in how to support my child with their homework.




What we found out	What we will do
Most respondents (95%) feel confident in how to support their child with their homework. Some comments identified a need for more information on how we teach maths and English.	Continue to review the information and support we provide for parents to support their child’s learning, e.g. through parent workshops or information sheets.

Q5) My child’s homework helps me to understand what they are learning at school.




What we found out	What we will do
83% of respondents said their child’s homework helped them understand what they are learning. Several parents commented that they would like more information about what their child is learning in school, particularly in maths.	Continue to review the information we share with parent about our curriculum and their child’s learning, including through homework.

Q6) I feel that homework is important to my child's learning.




Most parents (93%) feel that homework is important to their child's learning.

Q7) How much homework do you think your child should receive in English (in addition to daily reading)?




What we found out	What we will do
95% of parents would like their child to have some homework in English, in addition to daily reading. 75% of respondents feel this should be at least weekly.	Review the current provision of weekly homework in KS1.

Q8) How much homework do you think your child should receive in maths?



What we found out	What we will do
97% of respondents would like their child to receive regular homework in maths; 84% of these think this should be at least weekly.	Review our provision of maths homework. Review the current provision of weekly homework in KS1.

Q9) How much homework do you think your child should receive in other subjects?



What we found out	What we will do.
53% of parents feel their child should receive homework in other subjects at least once a week. Several parents commented that they would prefer more maths and English homework and less in other subjects.	Review the current format and the balance of maths and English homework against other subjects.
